Please find attached to this email He Pou a Rangi Climate Change Commission's advice on the direction of policy for the Government's second emissions reduction plan for the attention of the Climate Change Minister. This advice was prepared in line with the Commission's role as laid out in the Climate Change Response Act 2002 (the Act).

As outlined in section 5L of the Act, the Climate Change Minister is required to present a copy of the advice to the House of Representatives no later than 10 working days after receiving it.

If Parliament is not in session during this time, then the advice is to be presented as soon as practicable after the commencement of the next session of Parliament.

Section 5L also requires the Commission to make our advice publicly available as soon as practicable after it is presented to the House, but no later than 20 working days after providing it to the Minister – even if the advice has not been presented to the House by that date.

Previously, the Commission has supported the Minister in releasing final advice by publishing it on our website once it has been tabled and any public statement from the Minister has been made. Should the Office require a link to the published advice when the time comes, please do let me know.
