There are many who are understally contributing to climate harm but are not legally responsible because individually they have created the harm. I believe that there is seaso to make material contribution legally actionable.

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

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
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Thank you for allowing us to make submissions on the Climate Change and the emission goals for the next 15 years reducing net emission by 36% over the next 15 years and suggest we could achieve even more by not only focusing on the emissions to build a more sustainable future:

- Investing in electric light rail in the big cities, Auckland, Wellington, Dunedin and Christchurch (as appropriate).
- Changing the farm pasture used for domestic animals to reduce the flatulence and improve the resilience of the pasture (i.e. allow the animals to eat more natural weeds, rather than grass, etc). This is likely to require education and support of farmers.
- Rewarding farmers who plant trees by providing the appropriate seedlings for their land to provide more shelter belts for the domestic animals and to encourage tree farms. Reforest the steep hills that are not appropriate used for pasture with native bush.
- Even more native forests planted to replace some of the damage done by our domestic farming practices.
- Support organic farming and healthy and humane animal farming practices (i.e. no caged birds, etc).
- Clean up our waterways.
- Improve recycling by supporting councils so that more plastics and glass can be recycled. Banning the use of plastic where possible and providing inventive for the use of recycled plastics in everyday life.
- Support research and development innovation activities to use recycled materials to find new ways to do things with Government Grants and tax credits.
- Support sustainable building practices. Encourage the building of simple and warm houses using recycled products for less cost.
- Support the building of sustainable and strong seawalls to protect existing housing and our shoreline from the encroaching seas effected by the warming of the seas causing hurricanes and other natural disasters.

I also request that the NZ Government also supports the push to reduce human population growth and therefore the human footprint and support biodiversity so that we maintain and support wild animals in their natural environments. I ask the Government to become a champion of maintaining and protecting all the species who inhabit our planet. In particular:

- Provide free contraception for young and vulnerable NZ women and educate them on their use in schools.
- Encourage a healthy lifestyle by encouraging the eating of less meat and reduce the impact of unhealthy foods such as sugar on our population.
- Encourage healthy activity.
- Focus Government aid overseas on providing education and free contraception in poorer countries. Education of women changes a society as they strive for a better life. Also provide education to the boys to give them a chance for change.
- Reduce the use of poisons and additives on crops grown for human consumption.
- Enforce fishing quotas and continue to support sustainable farming of fishes and other water creatures (i.e. muscle farms) for human consumption rather than taking them from the sea.
- Protect the NZ native birdlife. Provide more safe habitats free from predators.
- Become a world champion for all the species, such as insects, mammals, reptiles, birds, and their habitats. They are all needed to provide balance and biodiversity to this planet.

- Reducing sheep and cow numbers by 15%
- A huge tree planting programme, including 25,000 hectares of native forests annually.

The Commission is seeking public feedback on its advice.
