Q4 What is your gender?

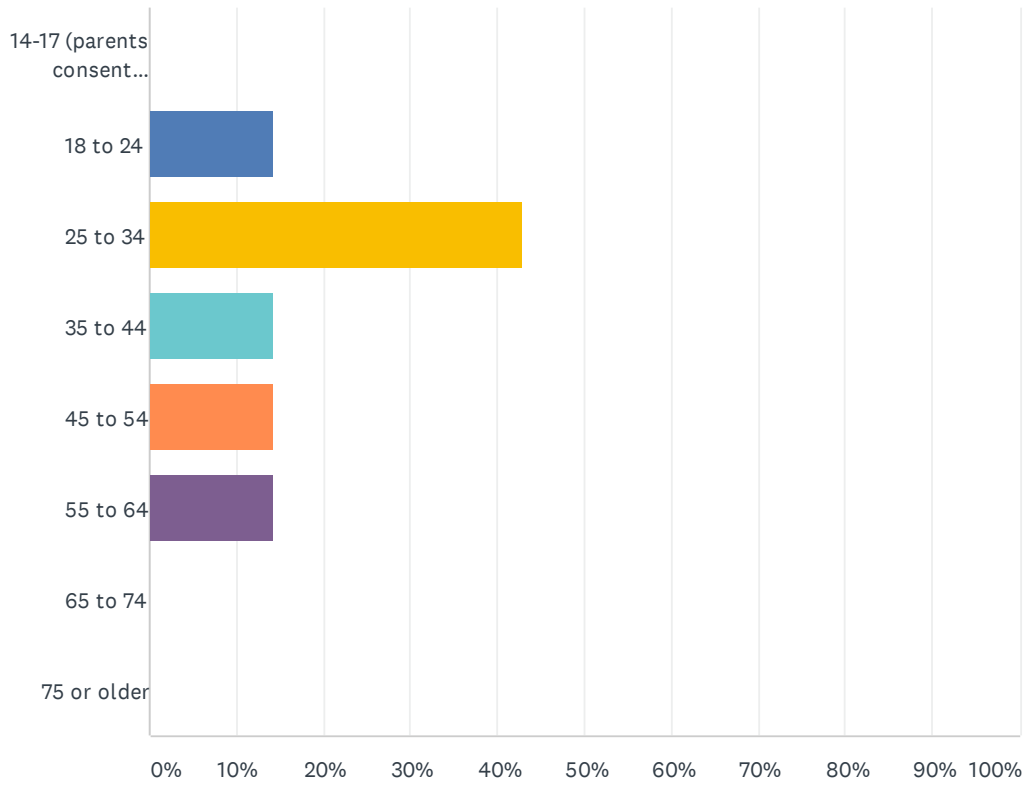

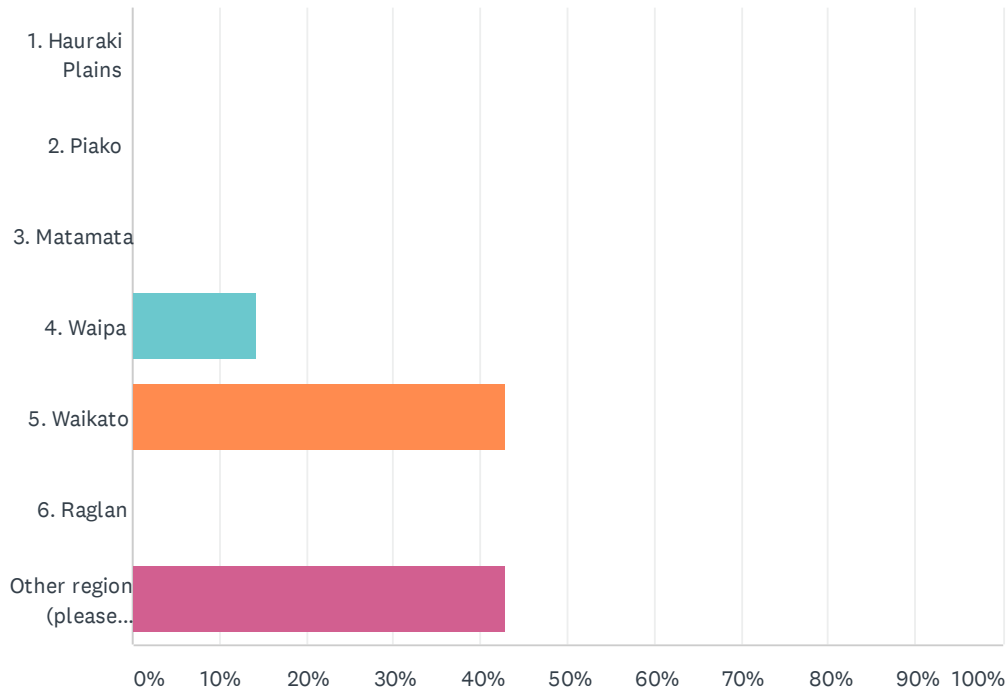

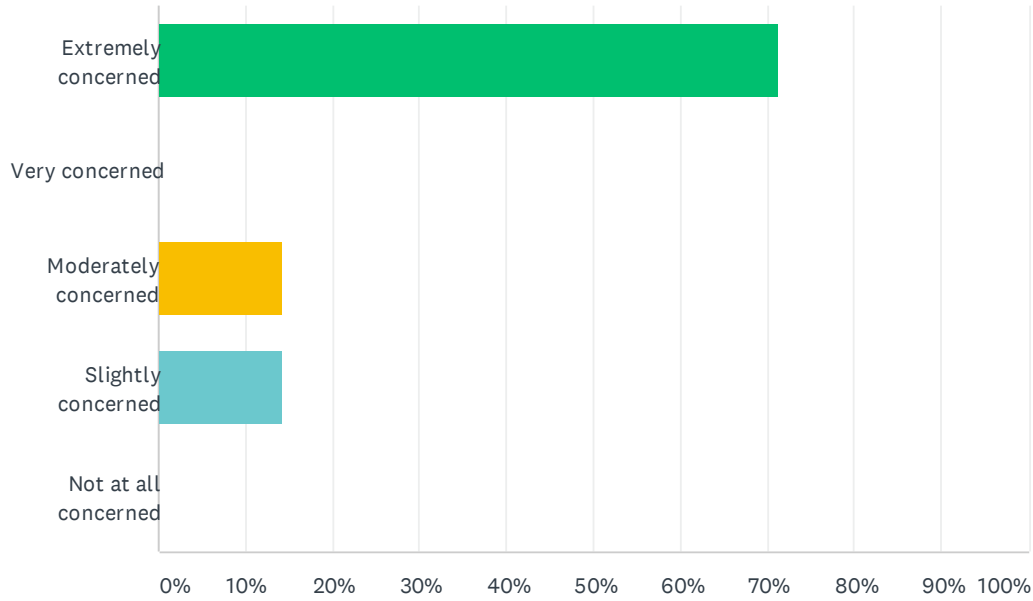

Q7 How concerned are you about climate change and sea level rise?

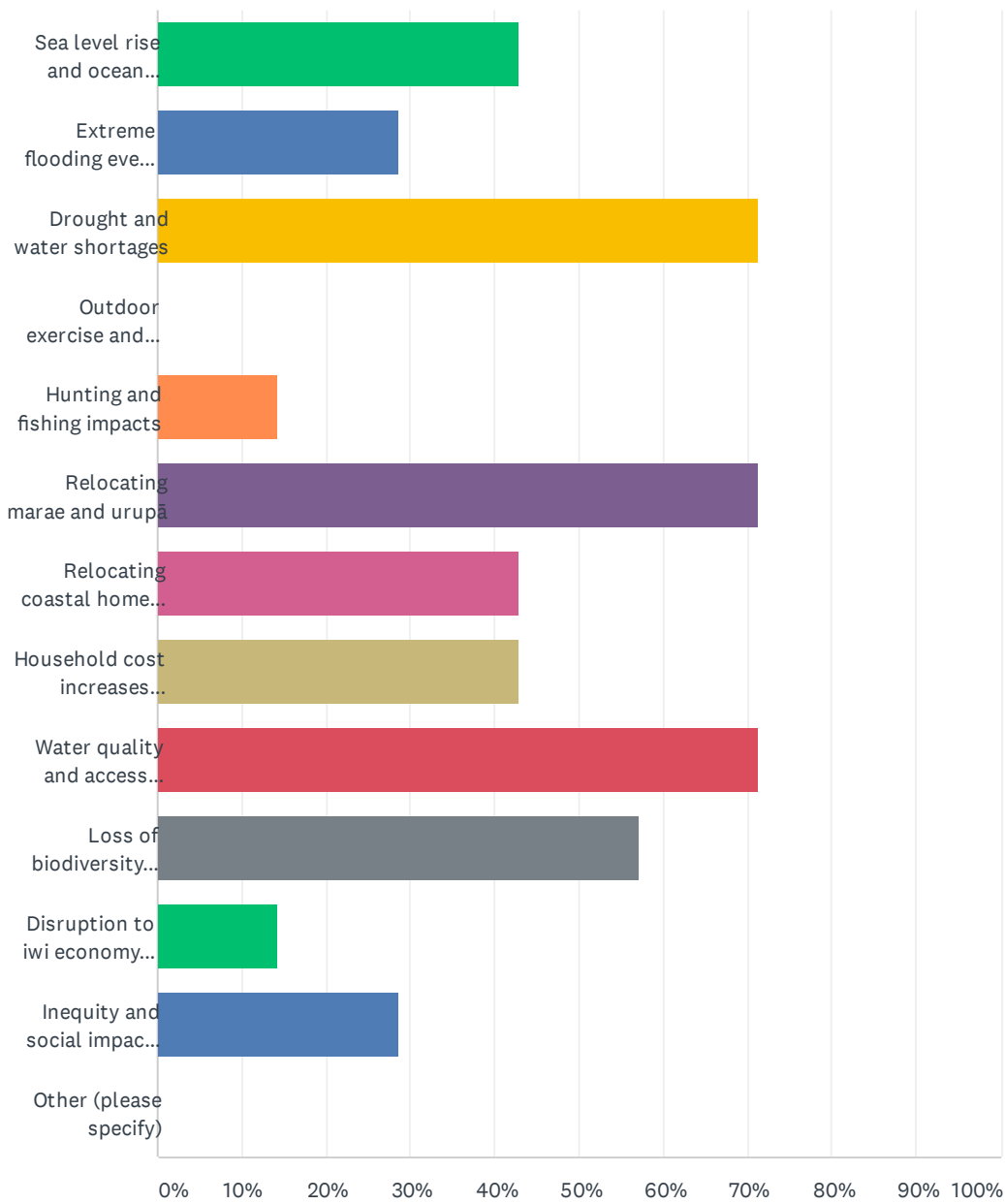

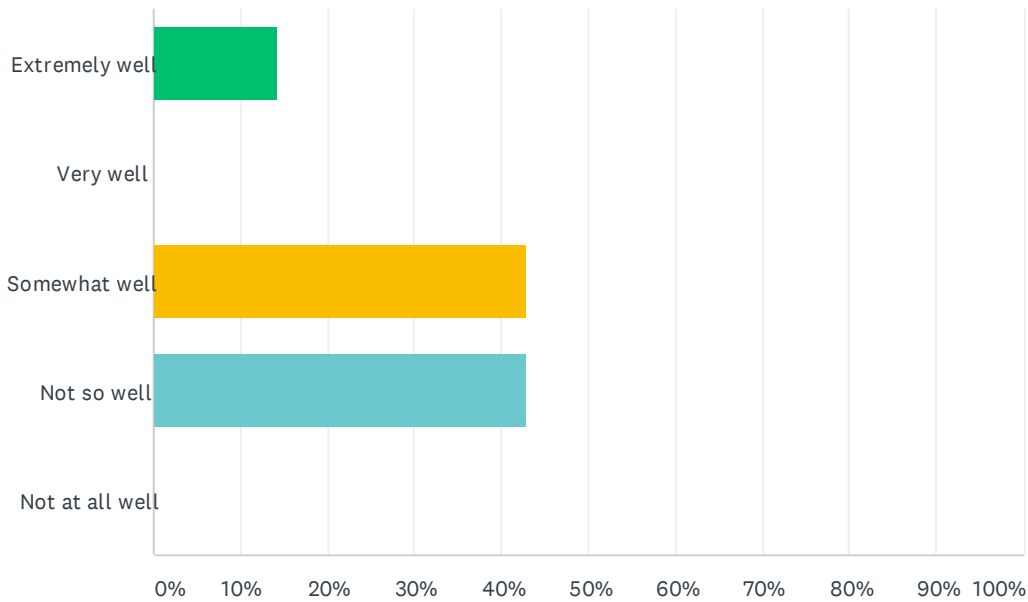

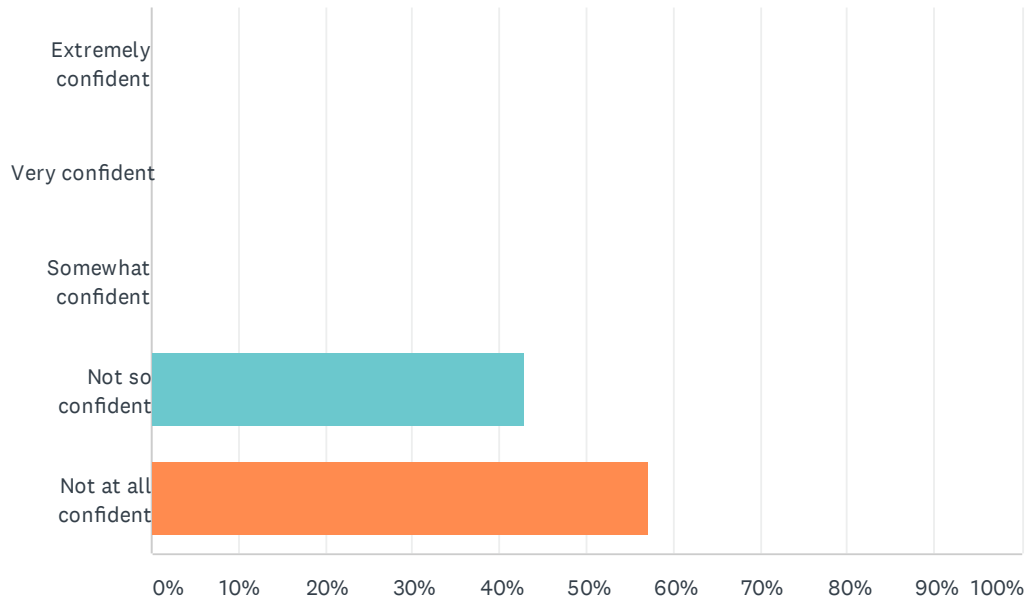

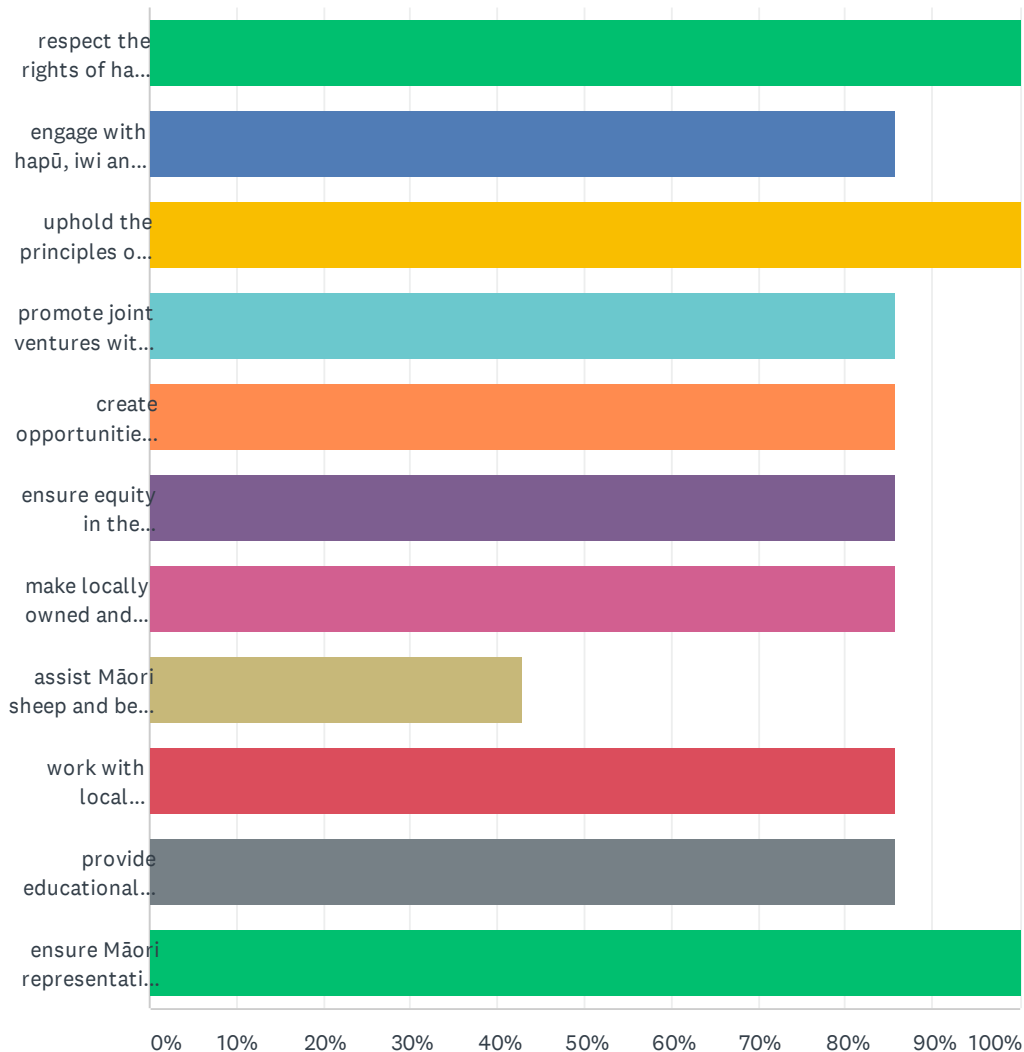

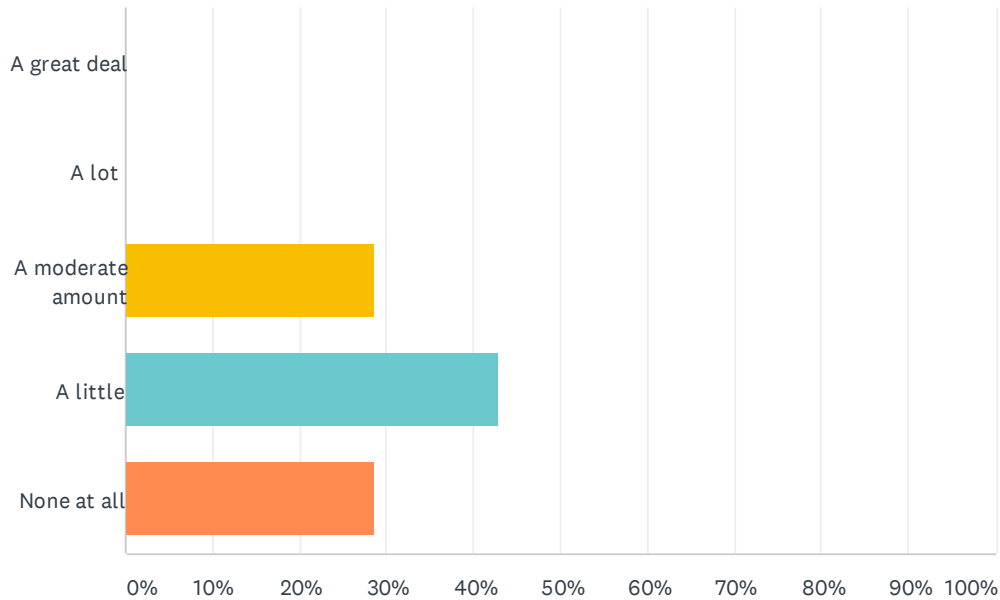

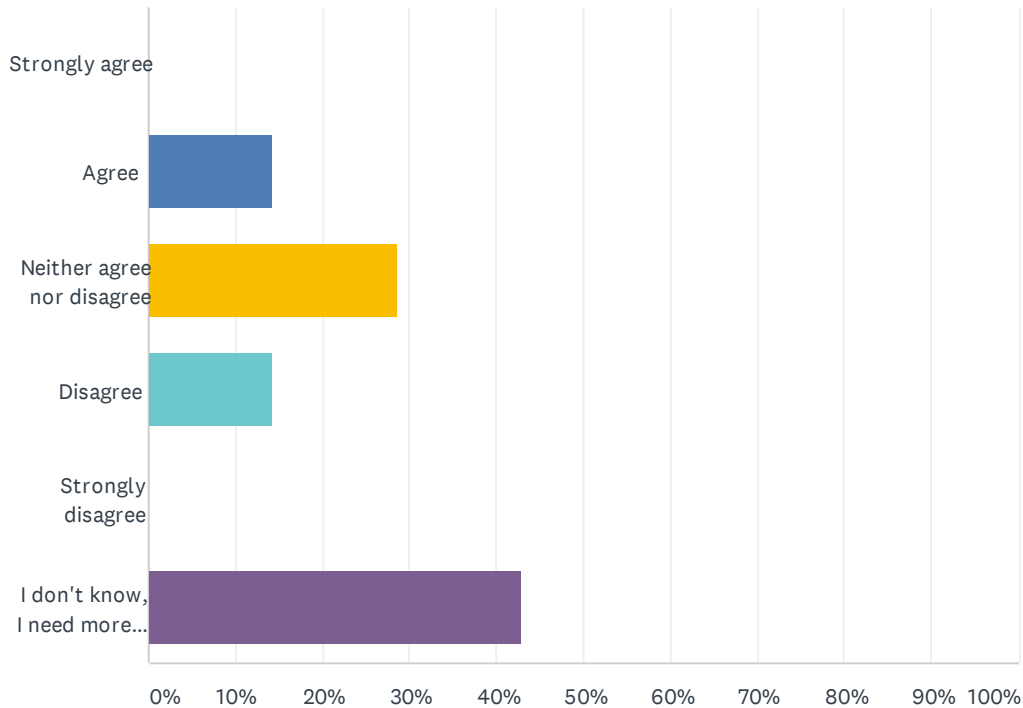

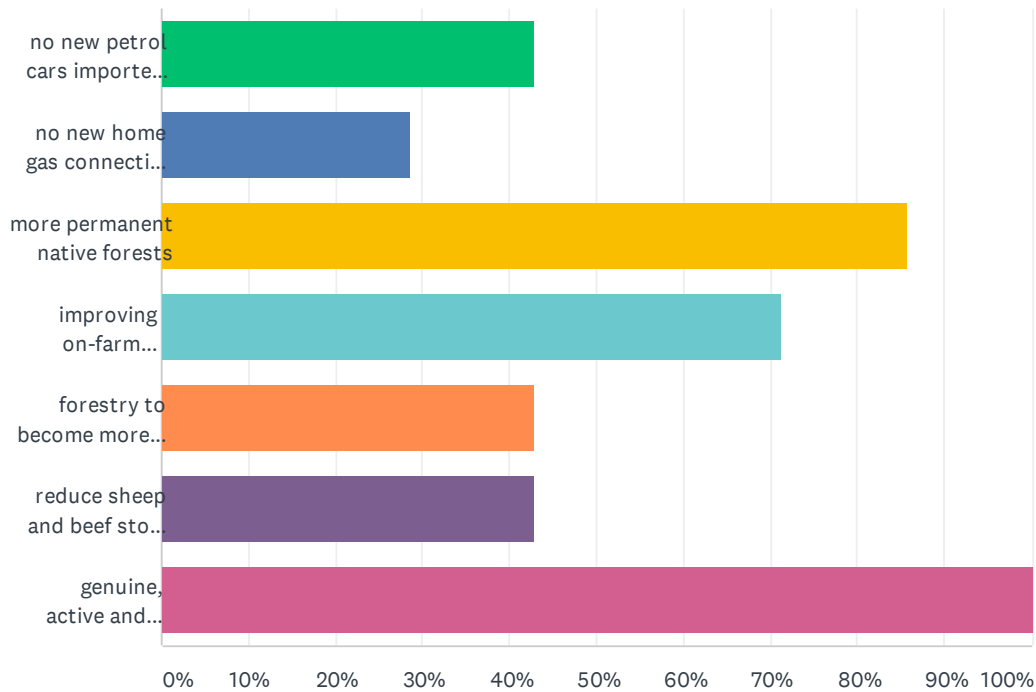

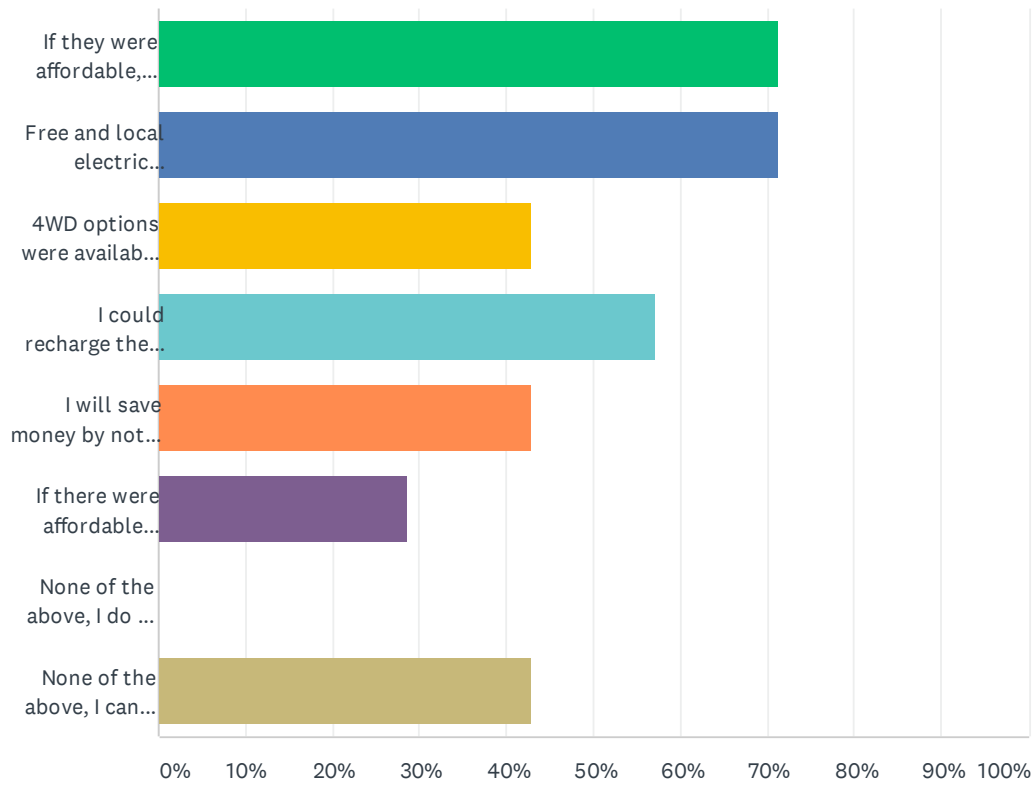

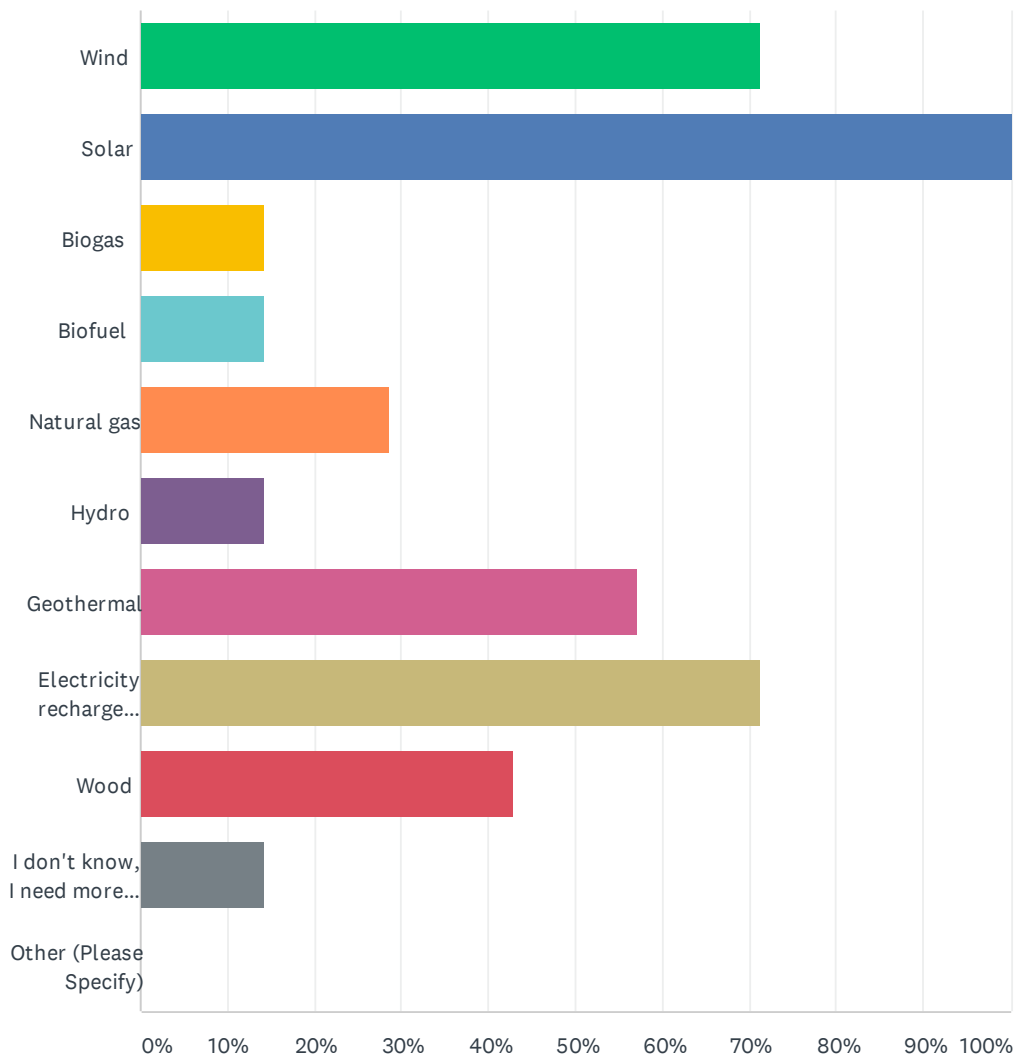

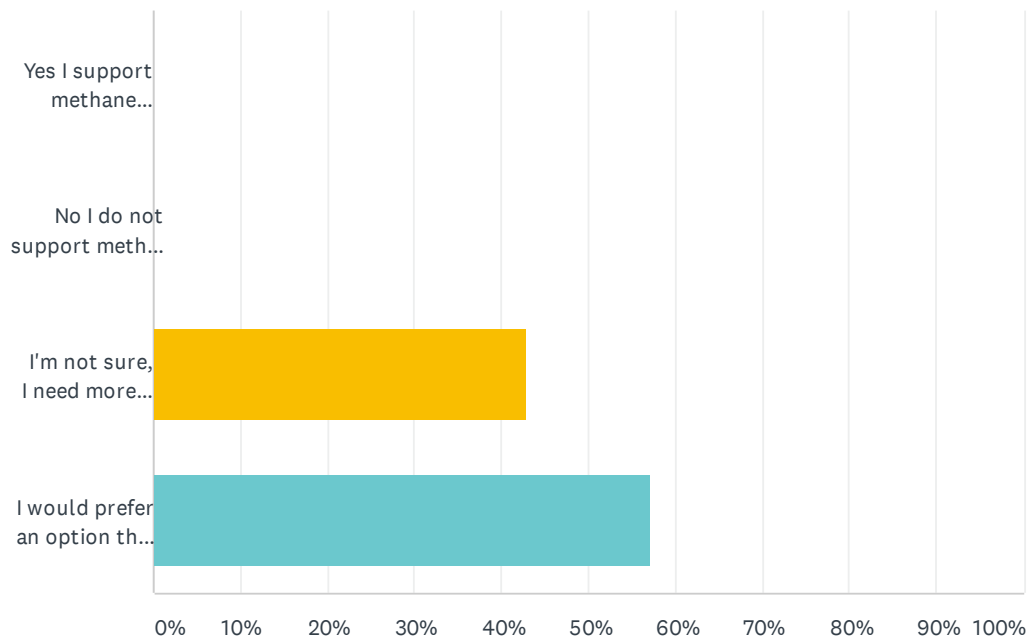

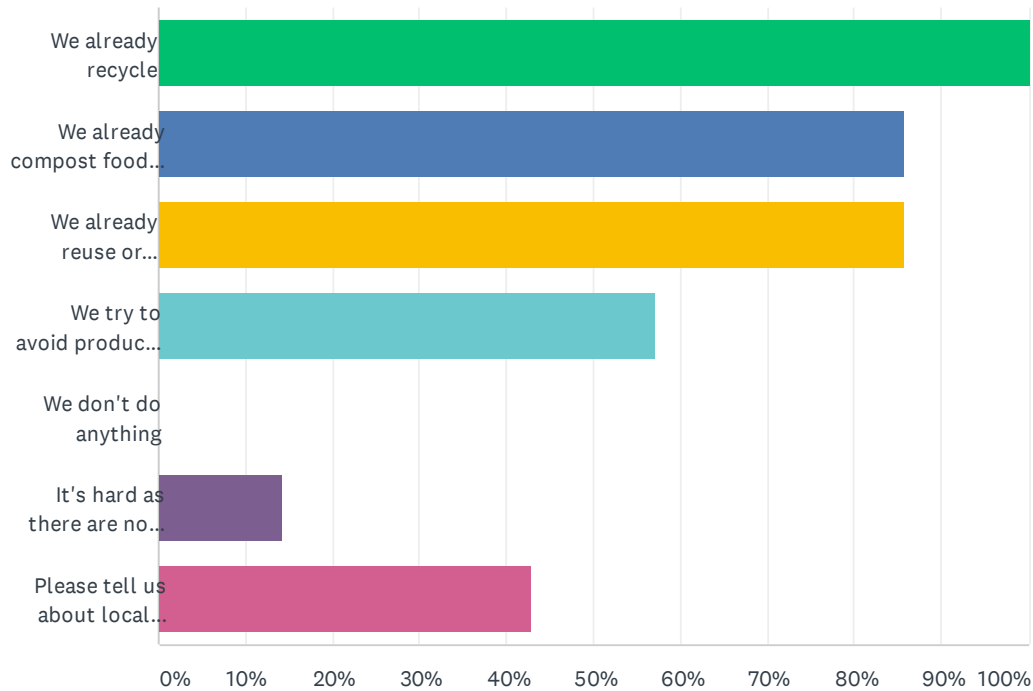

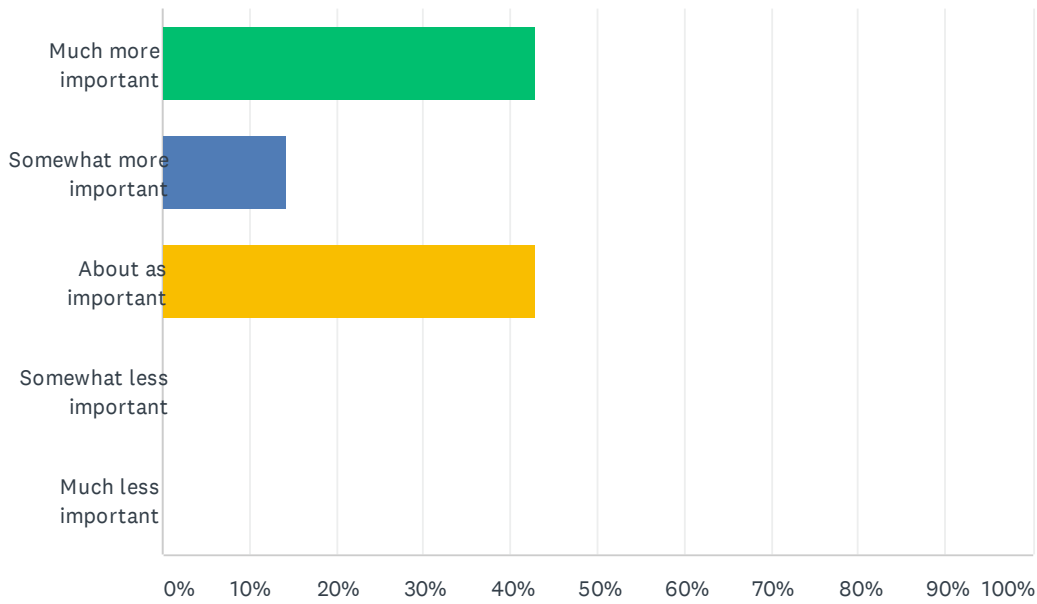

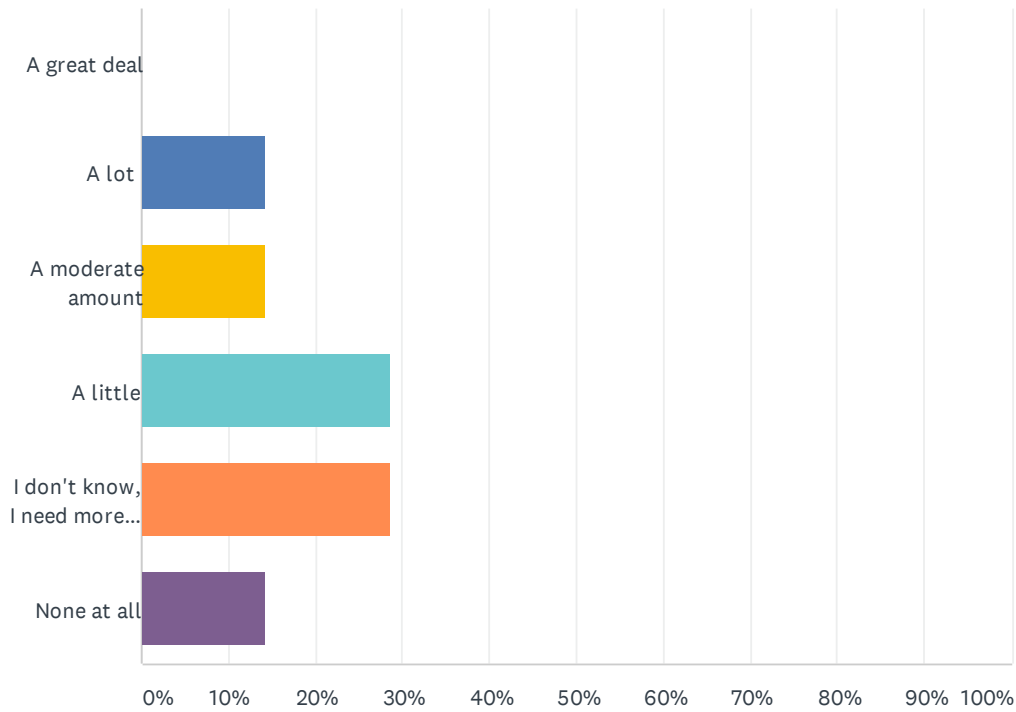

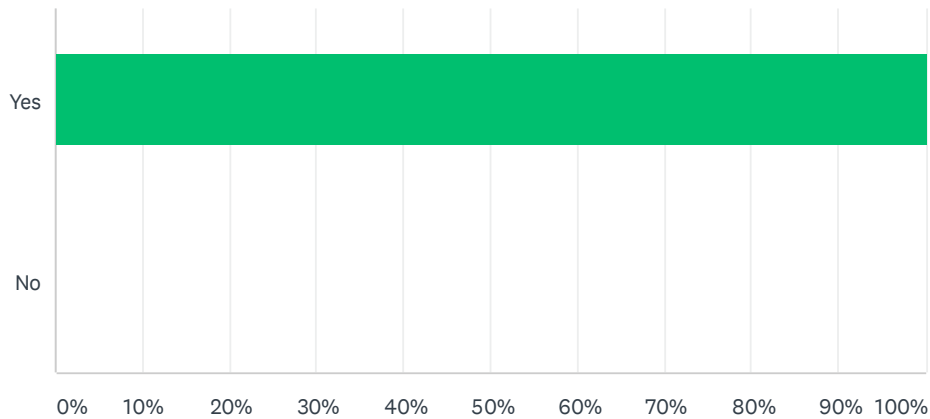
