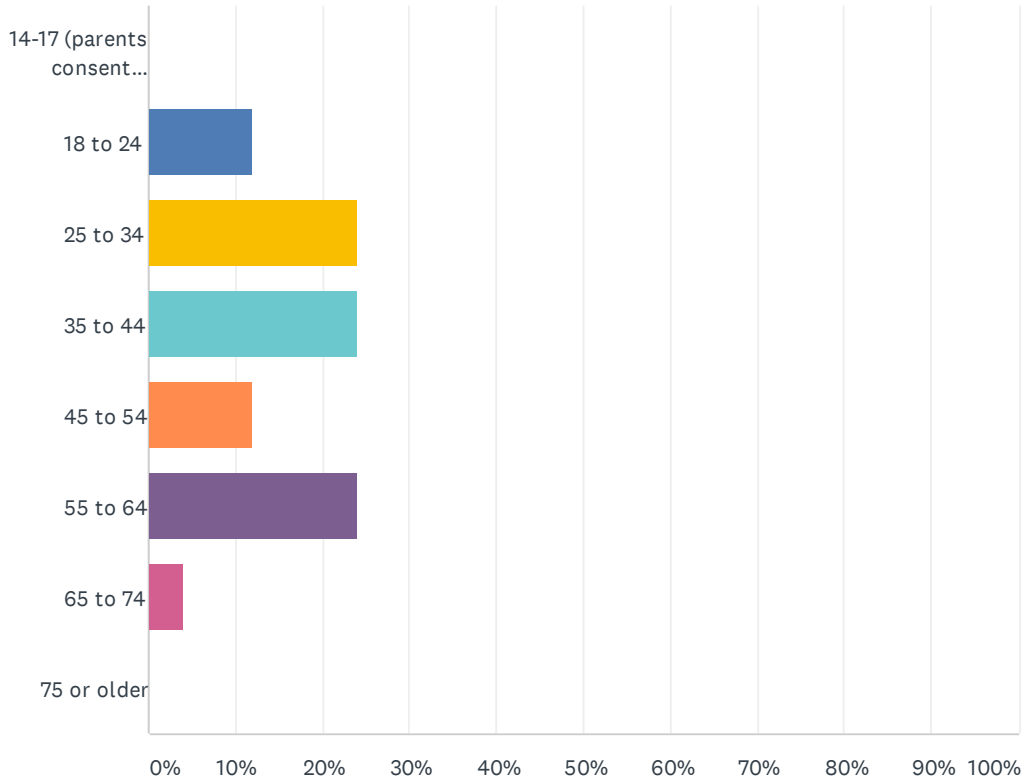

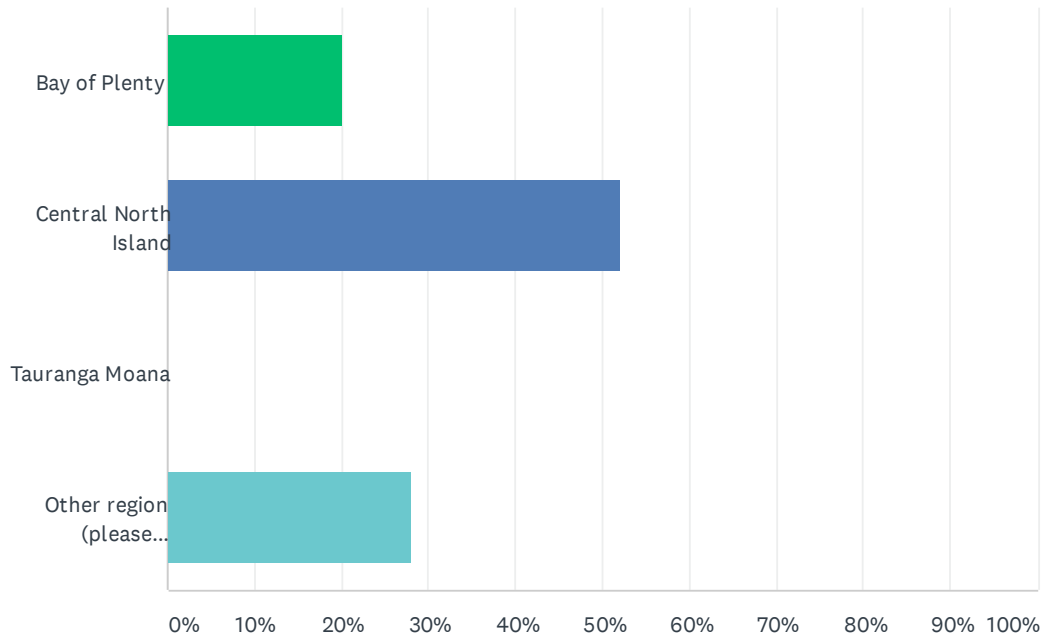

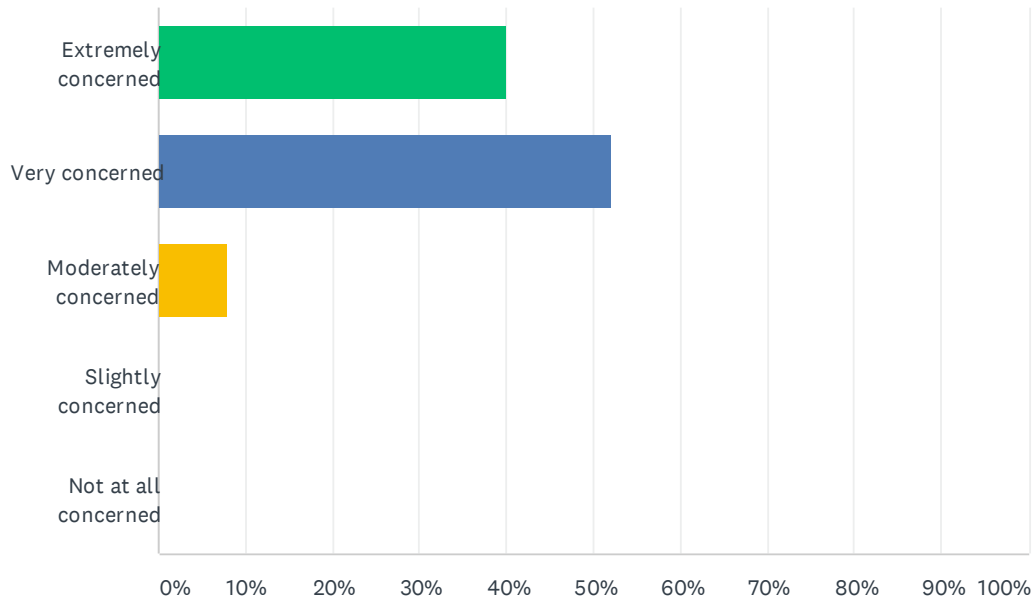

Q7 How concerned are you about climate change and sea level rise?

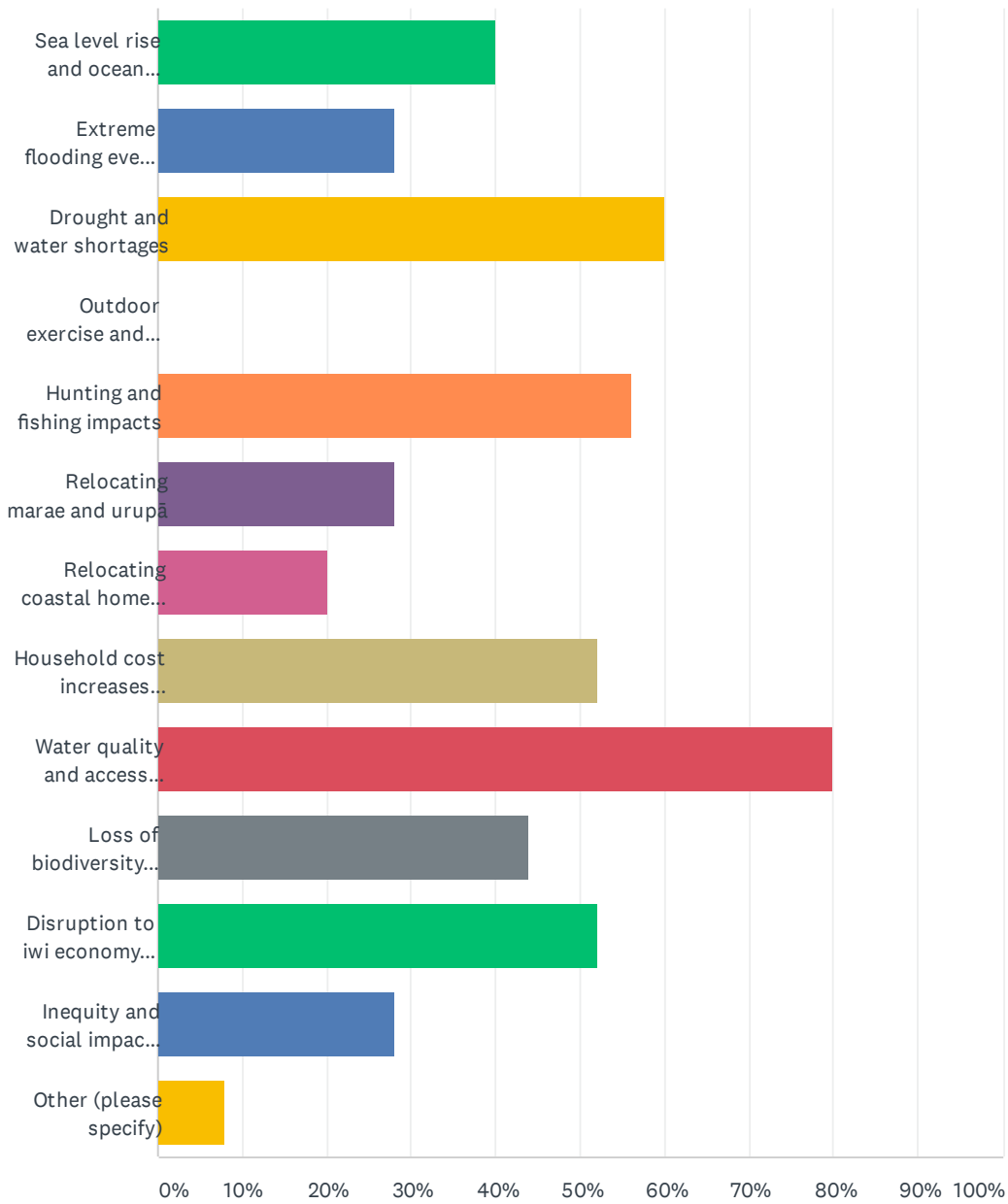

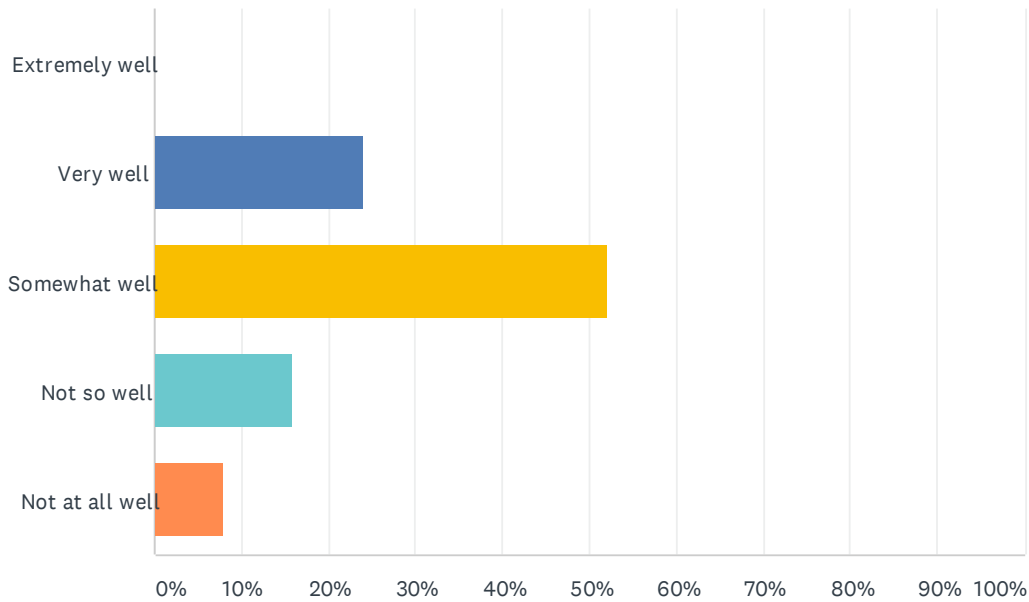

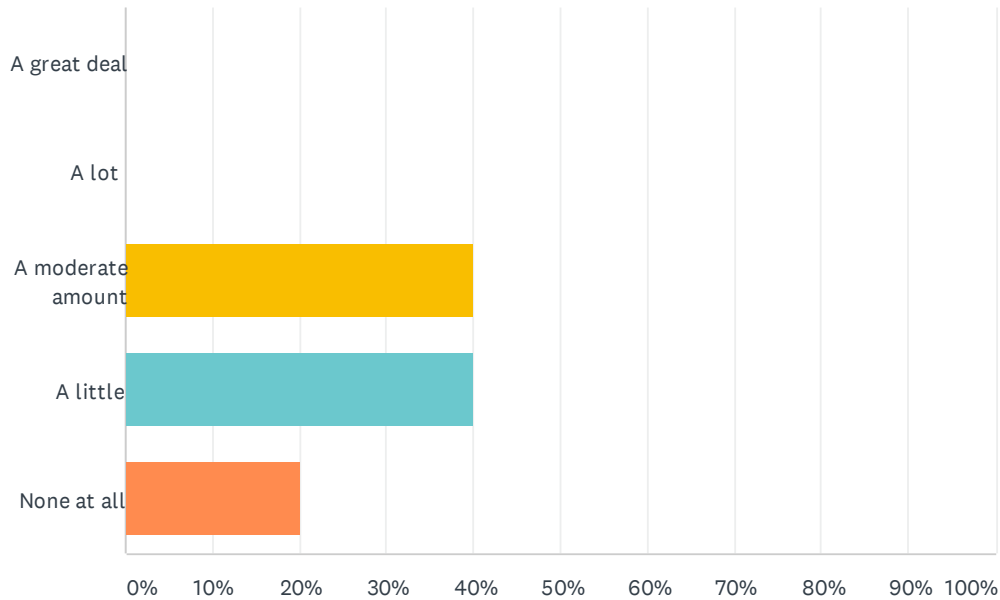

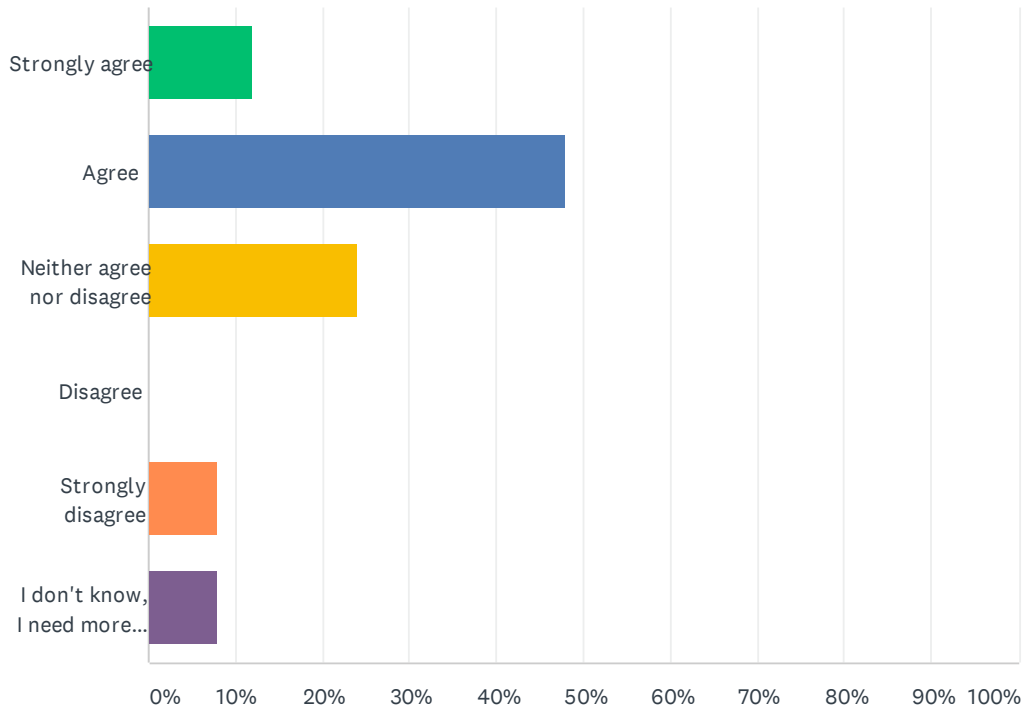

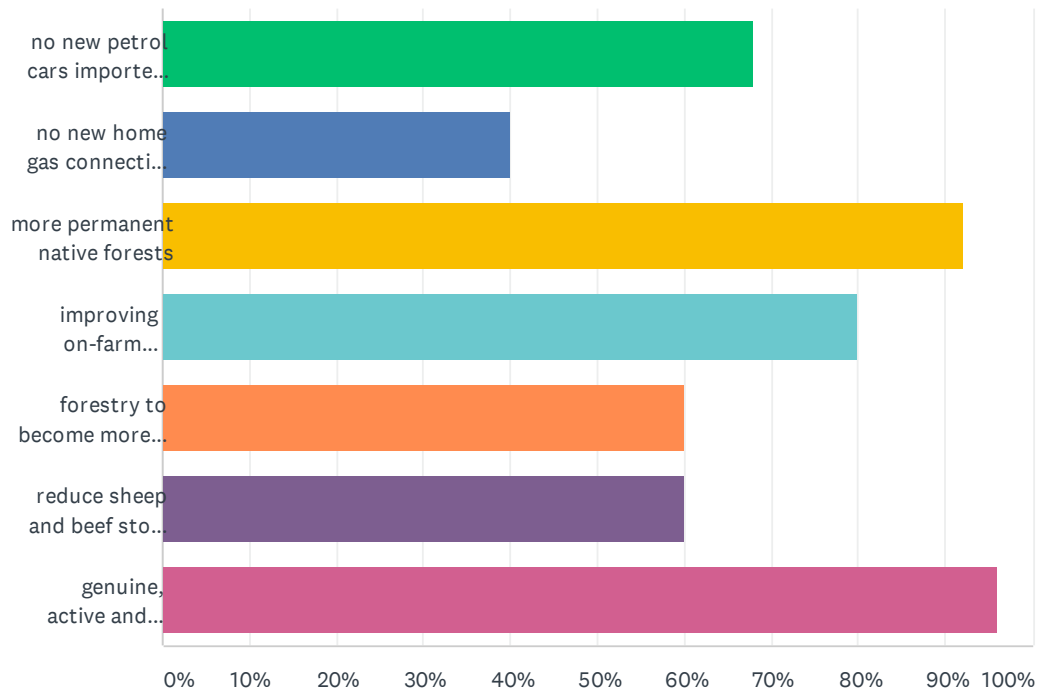

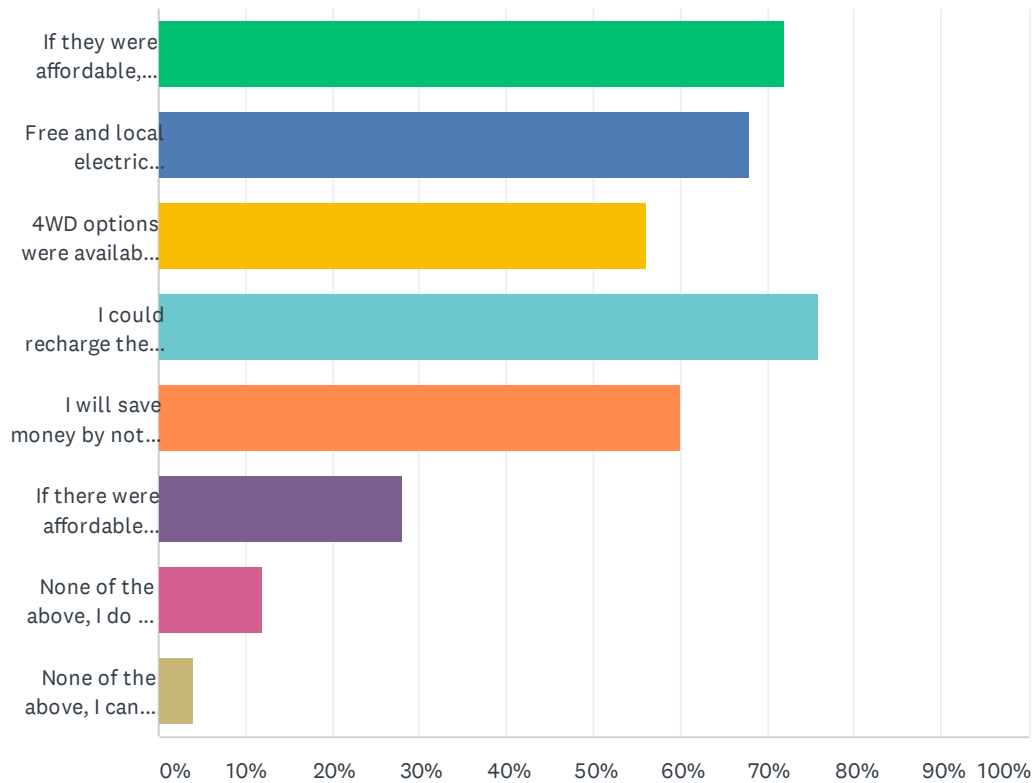

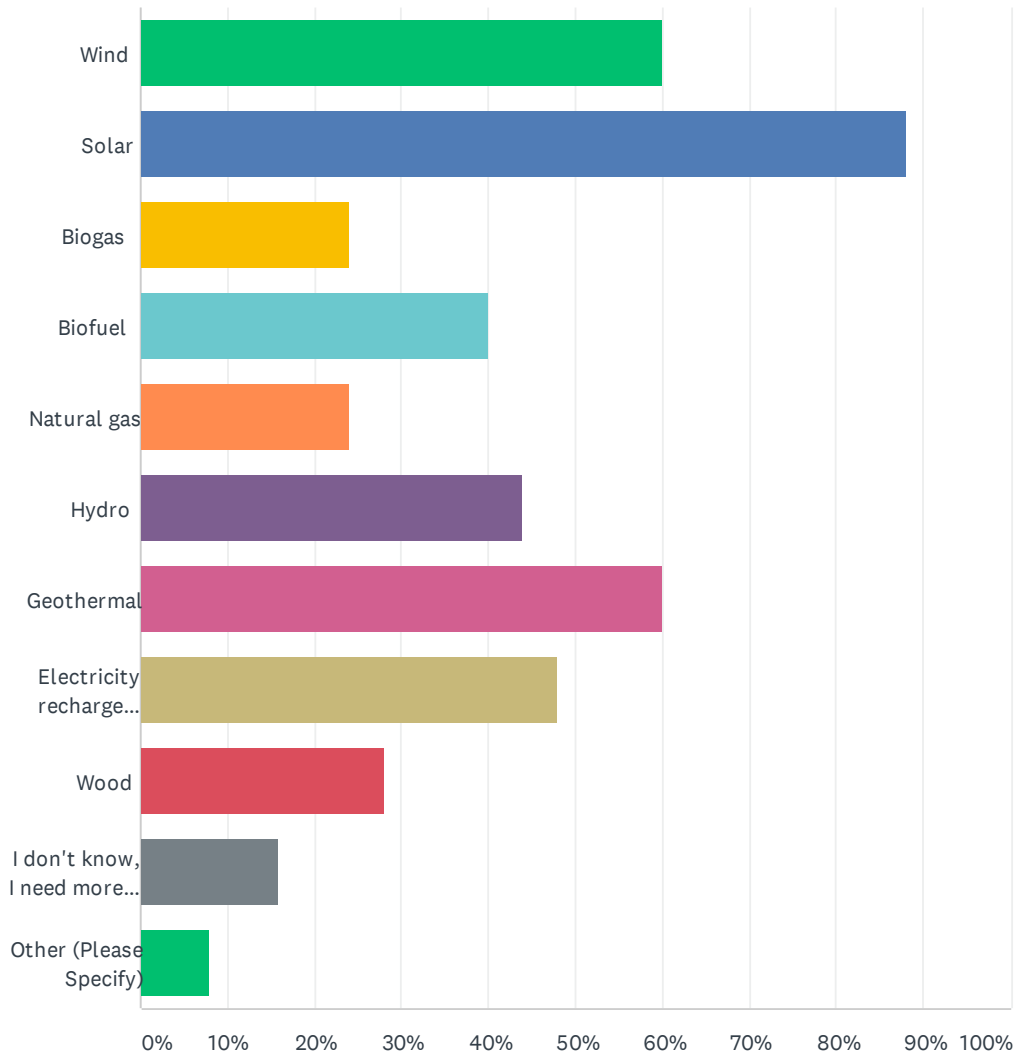

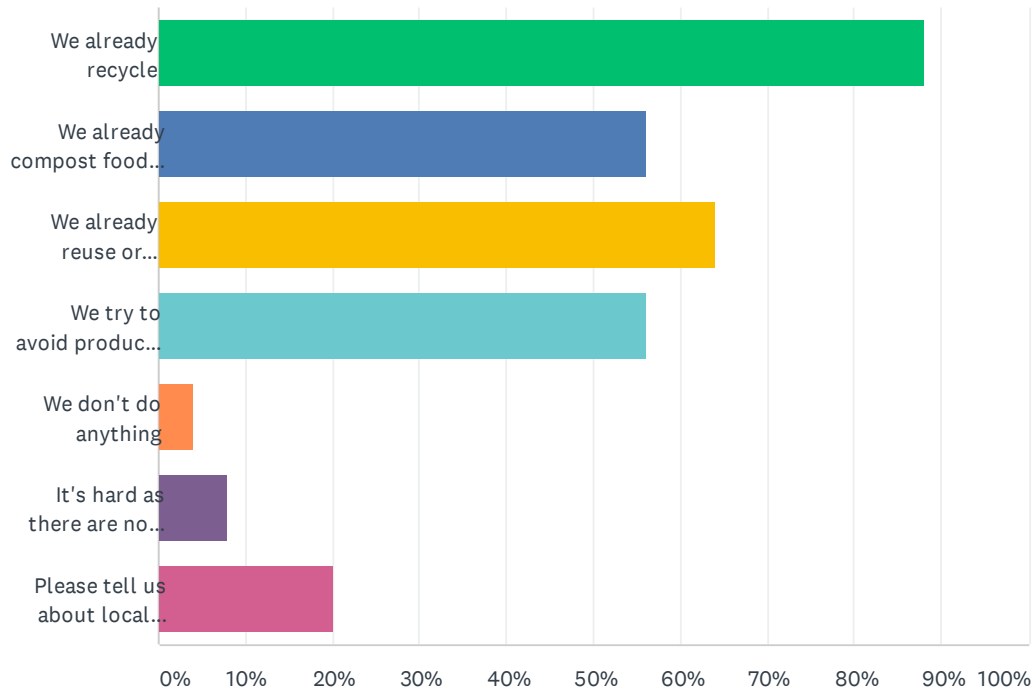

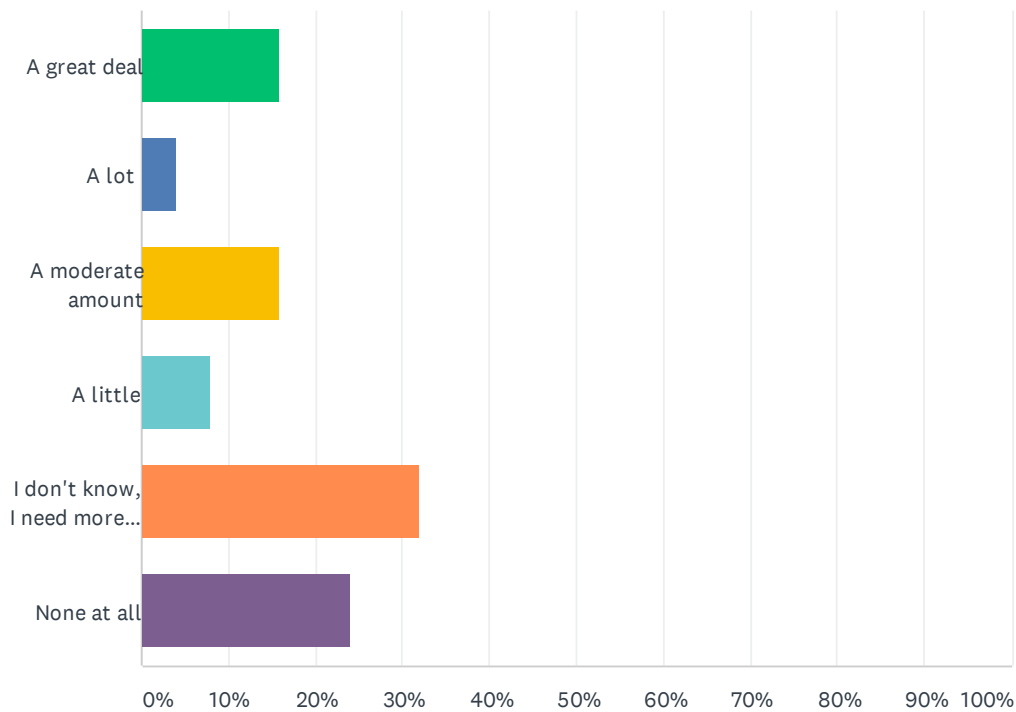
